

Fall Life Night's by Talitha Pereira

In a chaotic world of noise and distractions, we often struggle to hear God's voice. But in our fall series, we embarked on a profound journey that unveiled the Bible as God's living voice, speaking to us here and now. Here's the scoop:

In Session One, we met ordinary people from the Bible whose lives crossed paths with Jesus. This reminded us that just as God met them, he continues to stop us in our tracks, wherever we are. The Bible isn't just history; it's a living testament of God's power and loving desire to be in relationship with us.



Session Two rocked our understanding by showing the harmony between science and faith. Rather than contradicting, they complement one another. Science answers the who, what, when, and where, but it leaves us pondering the why. That's where God unveils His purpose for us - just like a creator knows His masterpieces.





In Session Three, we grappled with challenging Old Testament passages and found a God who relentlessly pursues a loving relationship with us. His goodness echoes through all of human history, revealing new dimensions of His character.

The final session brought clarity to our journey as we realised that the Church stands alongside us in understanding Scripture. We are a Church that wrestles with Scripture, and that wrestling only makes us stronger.

The Bible is not just a book; it's a life-changing adventure.

It shattered our expectations, bridged science and faith, spoke to our hearts and left us hungry for more.

In all walks of life, we have journeyed at some point and are continually journeying, even witnessing others' journeys. instances in the Liturgical especially during Lent, may it be figurative or literal, we all journeyed with Journeying from His resistance against temptation in the desert to His Passion, filled mixed emotions, conflict, perseverance throughout, leading to the most important event in our faith, Jesus' Resurrection on Easter Day. Easter is our origin story, from this point leading to Pentecost and onwards, Christianity sprouted, grew, and multiplied worldwide for generations to come. The Easter Vigil Mass is my personal favourite. Seeing how hard the Rosmini and Carmel College leaders work to prepare and participate in the celebration as I once did is amazing. The tension and confusion caused by preparation beforehand are finally relieved afterwards, and that's what the disciples felt in the absence of Jesus. It should remind us that we're allowed to feel this way, and eventually, Jesus will come down to us and show us the way.

The pandemic brought us unprecedented times, testing our strength and faith and removing the routine of gathering communally. We take for granted the community we have. We rely on it so much that we realize its importance in its absence. We pushed forward as Jesus would've wanted, and fortunately, we can return to the special events we miss.

Every aspect I've talked about had the common theme of community: as a community, we journeyed together, carried our crosses, celebrated our faith and continue to do so together. Easter is about us joining together to live out this incredible moment in history, serving as a reminder of the hope and redemption found in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
