Fr Christopher Brady, who left St Joseph's around Easter 2021 for retirement, died 17 April in Christchurch, aged 73. His funeral Mass was celebrated by Bishop Steve, along with Bishop Pat, 15 priests and a congregation



In retirement, Fr Christopher bought a house in Westport, where he was living when poor health saw him admitted to Christchurch hospital. Cancer, which had started in his prostate, spread to his lower back and spine. He was transferred to Burwood spinal unit for ten days, then to Nazareth House for end of

Christopher was born in Wellington, spent most of his youth in Whangarei, and began his seminary formation with Pat Dunn and others in 1968. He left the seminary for a period, working in the media. He was ordained priest in St Patrick's Cathedral in 1989, and served in parishes, school chaplaincy and hospital chaplaincy. Described as a "rough diamond", he was especially generous to people facing problems, and had an affinity with those on the margins. He loved sport, sang with enthusiasm, and generally did not require a microphone to be heard.

Fr Christopher is survived by his sisters, Patricia and Jennifer, and his brother Paul. May he rest in peace.
